Races included in this guide are U.S. Senate, U.S. House of Representatives, Auditor, Secretary of State, Treasurer, State Senate and State House of Representatives. Members of the U.S. House, State Senate and State House are elected by legislative district. Auditor, Secretary of State and Treasurer are on all Indiana ballots. Due to ongoing court cases regarding whether judges can respond to questionnaires and lack of response during previous election cycles, we did not mail questionnaires to judges.

Contact your county courthouse to find out which judges and other elected offices not included in this Voter Guide will be on your ballot on Election Day and how to get in touch with them.

Survey Questions for: US Senate & US House of Representatives

1. War on Terror – Bring U.S. troops home from Afghanistan immediately.

2. Education – Provide students with a set sum of money, which they can use in any public, private, religious or home school setting.

3. Healthcare – Repeal the federal changes made to the health care and health insurance industries passed by Congress and signed into law by President Obama.

4. Health – Use taxpayer funds to conduct medical research involving embryonic stem cells.

5. Health – Legalize physician-assisted suicide for terminally ill patients.

6. Health – Legalize cloning of human embryos.

7. Immigration – Prosecute business owners for unlawfully hiring illegal aliens.

8. Homosexual Agenda – Change discrimination laws to protect an employer's sexual preference in the same way that race, religion, age, gender and ancestry are protected.

9. Marriage – Amend the U.S. Constitution in order to define marriage as only between one man and one woman.

10. Judiciary – Selectively remove the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts when they fail to observe the separation of powers.

11. Energy – Encourage domestic oil drilling in places such as ANWR (Arctic National Wildlife Refuge), in Alaska.

12. Abortion – Prohibit abortion by law except when the life of the mother is in danger.

13. Abortion – Eliminate taxpayer funding to organizations providing abortions, such as Planned Parenthood.

14. Social Security – Give future retirees the option of a personal retirement account.

15. Taxes – Make federal tax cuts enacted during the George W. Bush administration permanent.

16. Energy – Enact "Cap and Trade" legislation (which would increase the cost of electricity, gasoline, natural gas, etc. through new taxes in order to decrease public demand for these sources of energy in the hope of reducing green-house gas emissions).

US SENATE COMMENTS: Dan Coats: Q2: I generally favor, but would like more information about how this will be executed and paid for. Q7: The federal process for certifying legal/illegal has a high percentage of error, subjecting businesses to prosecution for hiring based on faulty information from the federal government. This must also be addressed. Q10: I'm not sure what this means. I'll need additional information. Q12: I need an explanation to how the Hyde Amendment would apply to this. Q14: I do believe some Americans who are not near the retirement age should have some flexibility, but I would need additional information about the age requirement. US HOUSE COMMENTS: District 4: Todd Rokita: Q10: If this is in response to the court's ruling on Proposition 9 in California, while I am strongly opposed and deeply concerned by what has happened, I believe it is important that we allow the appeal process exhaust itself before we discuss changing the checks and balances and separation of powers in the federal government. In addition my number 9 in this questionaire would provide a solution for the California overreach. — District 5: Dan Burton: Q2: Education is a matter rightly left to the states to administer. I support the principle expressed but believe the funding should come from the states not the federal government. — District 8: John Cunningham: Q9: I do support a constitutional amendment, but feel that since marriage is conducted at the state level, the Indiana State Constitution should be amended to define marriage as 1 man and 1 woman. The federal government should be kept out of marriage.

Survey Questions for: Auditor, Secretary of State, Treasurer, State Senate & State House Candidates

- Education – Expand parental choice through tax credits or vouchers to allow children to attend any public, private, religious or home school.
- Education – Allow parents to home-school their children without imposing additional state regulations.
- Education – Require students in home-school settings to undergo standardized testing, such as ISTEP or other standardized tests.
- Health – Opt out of abortion coverage in the state health exchanges required under the federal changes made to the health care and health insurance industries passed by Congress and signed into law by President Obama.
- Faith – Jesus Christ is my personal Lord and Savior. I believe the God of the Bible is sovereign over all of life, including public policy, and I will use biblical principles to guide how I vote.
- Homosexual agenda – Change discrimination law to protect an employee's sexual preferences in the same way that race, religion, age, gender and ancestry are protected.
- ILLEGAL Immigration – Change state law similar to the reforms signed into law in Arizona earlier this year in order to reduce the number of non-U.S. citizens entering and residing in Indiana ILLEGALLY.
- Marriage – Increase the amount of time a married couple must wait for a divorce from 60 days to 180 days to give them a longer opportunity to work toward reconciliation.
- Marriage – Amend the Indiana Constitution as follows: "Only a marriage between one (1) man and one (1) woman shall be valid or recognized as a marriage in Indiana. A legal status identical or substantially similar to that of marriage for unmarried individuals shall not be valid or recognized."
- Abortion – Prohibit abortion by law except when the life of the mother is in danger.
- Abortion – Before an abortion, require written information be given to a woman stating that life begins at conception and that the baby in her womb can feel pain.
- Taxes – Increase state taxes in order to provide more services.
- Taxes – Discontinue state funding of Indiana's top abortion provider, Planned Parenthood.
- Gambling – Prohibit Casinos in Indiana.
- Sex industry – Require strip clubs to close at midnight and make them ineligible for Liquor licenses. Require dancers to remain at least 6 feet away from customers at all times.
